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creative space, for according to the terms of the donation, they had to be "talented and serious painters," appointed for life. They benefited from a studioapartment on the museum's top floor, and there Emmanuel-Michel 'Many' Benner, Alfred Giess and Georges Cheyssial succeeded each other from 1923 to 1997. In 2016, the new setting of Henner's furniture and artist's materials amongst closely-hung paintings in the grey studio, was designed to suggest his studio in the Place Pigalle, so providing visitors with a better understanding of his creative processes.

The winter garden has been returned to its original rôle as a reception room, reminding us of Madame Dubufe's salons at the end of the 19th century, when she hosted musicians, actors and other artists there every week.

Finally, through a partnership with the Beaux-Arts de Paris, a recently-graduated artist-inresidence is welcomed every year to carry out an artistic project related to Henner's work or to the mansion itself. In this way, the museum aims to remain faithful to the original spirit of the place.

This themed exhibition highlights the museum's first hundred years of existence and pays tribute to the women and men who have served as keepers of Henner's memory and of the museum itself. Objects and documents from the museum's archives, shown alongside a full illustrated timeline, will take you back in time from 2024 to 1924.

#### 31st March 1922

Marie Henner, widow of the painter's nephew, bought the private mansion 43 Avenue de Villiers, former home and studio of painter Guillaume Dubufe.

#### 19th June 1923

Donation by Marie Henner of the mansion and works by Henner to the State to create the National Jean-Jacques Henner Museum. The first curator was painter Emmanuel-Michel 'Many' Benner. The donation was officially accepted by the State on 27th August 1926.

#### March 1924

Inauguration of the museum by Léon Bérard, the Minister for Public Instruction and Fine Arts, on 7th March. Opening of the museum to the public on the 8th: entrance costs 1 franc and there were 46 visitors on the first day.

#### June 1926-March 1927

First closure of the museum, for renovation works, mainly to the winter garden: removal of the wall separating it from the Grand Salon and erection of the 4 columns, removal of the awning concealing the glass roof, laying of concrete over the mosaic floor. The museum reopened on 5th March 1927.

#### **June 1935-February 1936** Second closure of the

museum, for the construction of an apartment and studio for the painter-curator: the mansion gained 2 more floors. A lift was also installed in the patio. The museum reopened on 15th February 1936.

#### 1938-1946

Third closure of the museum, due to the threat of a new war. For safekeeping, the paintings were first transported to Marie Henner's Château d'Arny in Bruyères-le-Châtel, and then to the Château de la Ferté, near Reuilly, use of which was granted to the State by its owner, the Comtesse d'Escherny. The museum reopened on 22nd November 1946.

#### 1986

Isabelle de Lannoy's thesis Ecole du Louvre, *Jean-Jacques Henner (1829-1905) Essai de catalogue*, is the first scholarly work devoted to the artist. Her catalogue raisonné, organised in 2 volumes, was officially published in 2008.

#### 1990

Publication of the first scientific catalogue of the museum's paintings by Isabelle de Lannoy, new edition 2003.

# December 2001-May 2002

Fourth closure of the museum, for repairs to the winter garden. The rediscovery of the mosaic floor, covered up by Marie Henner in 1923, disrupted the plans but inspired a more global renovation project to bring the ground floor back to something nearer its original state. The museum partially reopened between 2002 to 2004.

#### 2005-2009

Fifth closure of the museum, for renovation works planned since 2001: rethinking of the exhibition spaces, rearrangement of the ticket office and museum shop, removal and replacement of the 1935 lift, electric installations brought up to standard. The museum reopened on 7th November 2009.

# June 2007-January 2008 Exhibition "Joon Joogues

Exhibition "Jean-Jacques Henner. The last Romantic in the face of Impressionism": retrospective presented at the Musée de la Vie Romantique, 100 years after the first retrospective organised by Jules Henner at the Cercle Volney in Paris.

#### 2011

Creation of a position dedicated to public service, communication and cultural programming. The museum's visibility and outreach are strengthened through various activities and partnerships.

### February-July 2012

Temporary exhibition at the Henner Museum: "Henner's landscapes. From impression to dream".

# November 2012-September 2013

Temporary exhibition at the museum: "Sensuality and Spirituality. In search of the Absolute".

#### 2014-2016


Sixth closure of the museum, for renovation works: rethinking of the exhibition spaces, restoration of the winter garden (glass roof and mosaic floor), renovation of the public reception areas, creation of storage rooms for the collections. The museum reopened on 21st May 2016. The restoration of the winter garden permitted the development of an important and varied cultural programme of concerts, lectures, workshops... An interpretation space and mediation devices dedicated to the Plaine Monceau and the history of the mansion since its origins are created.

#### January-May 2019

Temporary exhibition at the museum: "Ginger! From Jean-Jacques Henner to Sonia Rykiel".

#### 2019

The museum was awarded the «Maison des Illustres» label in the name of Guillaume Dubufe, aknowledging the heritage interest of the home-studio.

#### March 2020-May 2021

Seventh closure of the museum, due to the Covid 19 pandemic. The museum opened briefly for 2 months between September and October 2020.

#### October 2021-January 2022

Retrospective of Henner's works at the Musée des Beaux-Arts of Strasbourg, in partnership with the Henner Museum, which presented the exhibition "Alsace. Dreams of the Lost Province" at the same time.
